Regular Transport:

Regular Transport's main purpose is a chance for you to pick up mail, packages, prescriptions, groceries, schedule appointments, pay bills etc. If being transported, you can ask to stop for hot and ready food on the way home or throughout the trip, if all parties are agreed

Regular Transport is scheduled for the first three Mondays of every month.

1st Monday heads to Overton area.

2nd Monday heads to Mesquite.

3rd Monday heads to Las Vegas

This means of transport is carpool-style with 6 seats available. To be added to the list for transport, simply call ahead, email, or stop by the Family Advocate office to put your name down for one of the Monday's scheduled. This is first come first served, and with that seats may sometimes fill fast. And to be considerate of others please try not to reserve all the seats, however you can reserve 1-2 more seats depending on availability, if you need others to accompany you.

**This is not for medical appointments, please schedule medical transport with CHR through the clinic. However, it has also been approved again for CHR transporters to make some other stops on the way home, if you would like to utilize that resource as well. **

Regular Transport Request:

A Regular Transport Request is used when you can't or are unable to utilize the regular transport scheduled days. Whether you had a scheduling conflict, you missed the day you scheduled, or the transport van was already fully booked.

Special Transport Request:

A Special Transport Request is used when the need for transport is different than the use of regular transport dates, in that your request is for a special event. It can be a request for a single person or family (dependent on the seats of the vehicle). Events most likely to be given request approval are Cultural Events, Education/School Events, or Family Events (i.e. celebration/funeral or child visit).
